MESSAGE FROM THE COMMANDING OFFICER

Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort is proud to be one of the seven installations within the Marine Corps Installations East area of operations. MCAS Beaufort is home to all of the F/A-18 Hornets in 2d Marine Aircraft Wing under the command of Marine Aircraft Group 31.



Our mission is to provide training opportunities and support that allows our Marines, Sailors, and families to prepare for combat and the challenges of Overseas Contingency Operations. Beaufort's Marines and Sailors are constantly deployed in combat and contingency operations around the world. Our community has a direct role in protecting our nation.

We are, likewise, proud to be part of the Lowcountry family. An essential part of our success is preserving the extraordinary community relations enjoyed by MCAS Beaufort and ensuring the long-term viability of this installation. We do that primarily through active community service, partnering to control encroachment, and supporting the economic vitality of the Lowcountry as one of the largest employers in Beaufort County.

Our direct economic impact in 2010 included active duty military and current civilian employee salaries of more than \$187.9 million. Construction contracts and materials, supplies and services totaled \$159.1 million of which \$13.9 million went to companies in South Carolina.

Additionally, MCAS Beaufort has formed partnerships throughout the region on projects to ensure compatible development around the Air Station and Townsend Bombing Range; our air-to-ground training area in southeast Georgia. Through the end of 2010, the Marine Corps and our partners have invested \$63.6 million to protect 23,383 acres from development incompatible with the Air Station's mission.

The personal and public support our service members receive from our neighbors in the Beaufort area is essential to the success of each unit stationed here. Marines and Sailors are fortunate to live in such a supportive and welcoming community. This is an ideal environment for us in which to live and prepare for the next deployment. We look forward to serving the community and continuing to play a vital role in our nation's defense.
