1. $\underline{\text{Purpose}}$. To establish the procedures, agency responsibilities, and follow-on support to any military or civilian aviation mishap or emergency that occurs aboard or in the vicinity of MCAS Beaufort.

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- 2. <u>Situation</u>. This Air Station Order, also referred to as "Pre-Mishap Plan," consolidates standardized instructions for initial response, reporting, and subsequent required actions in support of an Aviation Flight Mishap (FM), Flight Related Mishap (FRM), Aviation Ground Mishap (AGM), or declared emergency that occurs either on this installation or in the local flying area in accordance with references (a) through (n).
- 3. $\underline{\text{Mission}}$. The Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort Pre-Mishap Plan provides standardized instructions for initial response, reporting, and subsequent required actions in support of Aviation Flight Mishap (FM), Flight Related Mishap (FRM), Aviation Ground Mishap (AGM), or declared emergency that occurs either on this installation or in the local flying are.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent

- (a) This Order is the guiding directive for MCAS Beaufort premishap planning, mishap response, investigation preparedness, investigation implementation, and support functions.
- (b) This order clarifies responsibilities for responding to aircraft mishaps and emergencies. It also outlines responsibilities in supporting the reporting custodian/responsible agency during the aviation mishap investigation process.
- (c) MCAS Beaufort must do all that it can to ensure an orderly and highly efficient response to an aircraft mishap or emergency. Delay or confusion in our response could cost the needless loss of life or property. Being thoroughly familiar with our roles and responsibilities, coupled with periodic exercises, will ensure MCAS Beaufort is prepared to respond and trained to support the investigating agency, whether it is one of our supported squadrons, another military service, or civil aviation.
- (2) <u>Concept of Operations</u>. This Order provides guidance for responding to aircraft mishaps and emergencies occurring aboard the MCAS Beaufort installation and in the vicinity of the installation.
- b. $\underline{\text{Subordinate Element Missions}}$. Comply with the intent of this order to include active participation in all Air Station aviation mishap drills and exercises.

$\hbox{\tt c.} \ \underline{\hbox{\tt Coordinating Instructions}}$

- (1) Each Station responding and supporting agencies shall make sure their specific response procedures comply with the contents of this Order.
- (2) Submit all recommendations concerning this Order to the MCAS Beaufort S-3/5/7 Directorate (Attn: S-5 Mission Assurance, Installation Emergency Management) via the appropriate chain of command.
- (3) The Director, S-3/5/7, will administer the requirements and ensure the accuracy, modification, and distribution of this Order.

6. Administration and Logistics.

a. The Commanding Officer, MCAS Beaufort, the Commanding Officer, Marine Aircraft Group-31, the Officer-in-Charge of Naval Medical Clinic Beaufort, and Commander Fleet Readiness Center East (FRCE) concur with the contents of this Order in so far as it pertains to their respective command.

b. Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI)

- (1) Unless specifically marked as classified (e.g. Confidential, Secret, and Top Secret) the following are categories are subsets of Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI) and are to be protected in accordance with 32 CFR Part 2002: Agriculture, Critical Infrastructure, Emergency Management, Export Control, Financial, Geodetic Product Information, Immigration, Information Systems Vulnerability Information, Intelligence International Agreements, Law Enforcement, Legal, Natural and Cultural Resources, NATO Controlled, Nuclear, Patent, Privacy, Procurement and Acquisition, Proprietary Business Information, SAFETY Act Information, Statistical and Tax.
- (2) All individuals handling this information are required to protect it from unauthorized disclosure. Handling, storage, reproduction, and disposition of the attached document(s) must be in accordance with 32 CFR Part 2002 and applicable agency policy.
- (3) Access to and dissemination of Controlled Unclassified Information shall be allowed as necessary and permissible to any individual(s), organization(s), or grouping(s) of users, provided such access or dissemination is consistent with o in furtherance of a Lawful Government Purpose and in a manner consistent with applicable law, regulations, and Government-wide policies.
- c. Records Management. Records created as a result of this Plan shall be managed according to national archives and records administration (NARA) approved dispositions per (w) and (y) to ensure proper maintenance, use, accessibility and preservation, regardless of format or medium. Refer to references (z) for Marine Corps records management policy and procedures.

7. Command and Signal

- a. $\underline{\text{Command}}$. This Plan is applicable to all MCAS Beaufort departments, divisions, sections, personnel and tenants who support the mission of MCAS Beaufort.
 - b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.
