Professionalism – During work and liberty. You have a responsibility to care for yourself and each other. Being a professional does not mean "error free". Honest mistakes will be made, but our aim is to limit and ultimately avoid repeating them. Never let pride or ego drive decision-making. As an expert in your profession, recognize when it is time to seek assistance.

Standards – Maintain them. Be disciplined and uncompromising in adherence to policies and procedures. Time constraint is not an excuse to compromise the standard. Use sound judgment. Willful violation of standard may subject one another to unnecessary risk.

Communication – Clear and thorough. Misunderstanding or ignorance can lead to poor assumptions and failed execution. Be direct. Ensure your body language mirrors your words. I expect each of you to have moral courage to speak up regardless of rank or title. You are empowered to inquire, interject, and stop any action if you recognize the potential for harm or danger.
